

Rural Mental Health Support is a program funded through Central Lakes College to address the importance of mental health services in helping farm families achieve their business and family goals. Services are made available to farm business management members, FBM staff, and their families.

This program's main objective is to deliver mental health services in an effort to assist individuals with the mounting stress, anxiety, and depression experienced by farmers, FBM instructors, and their respective families. Rural Mental Health Support is a free and confidential service.

Services are provided to individuals at their home by Dan Marquardsen, Licensed Psychological Practitioner. However, services can be provided at CORE Psychological Services' Brainerd office if preferred. Are you experiencing the following, or do you know someone who is?

- Depression
- D Physical, emotional, or sexual abuse
- Chemical abuse
- Gambling addictions/problems
- Anxiety (regarding financial problems,
- weather, technology decisions, etc.)
- Suicide
- Feelings of exhaustion
- Parenting questions / stress related to parenting
- Other areas of concern

Making an Appointment

To make an appointment, you may call (218) 838-6676 at any time. If you are not having a crisis that needs immediate attention, please call between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. If no one is available to answer your call, please leave a voice-mail message with your name, number, and your general location (nearest town), and be sure to mention if your situation requires immediate attention. If you prefer that we do not leave a message with someone other than you, or on an answering machine, please specify that in your message, Messages are checked numerous times. during the day. If your calls are not returned in a timely manner, please call CORE Psychological Services at 218-829-7140. Phones are answered at this office Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. or 7 p.m.,

FBM Instructors If you would like to refer a student, you may either set up the appointment or call with the name and number of the student for the therapist to contact. If you do leave a student's name and number, please be sure the student has agreed to have the therapist contact him/her.

Services are free for all FBM instructors and family members, as well as students/farmers involved in the program and their family members. Individual and family counseling is available for all ages. The program is voluntary and there is no obligation to continue counseling. Services provided are confidential and no information about services provided will be shared with FBM instructors or the students. Instructors may be involved in setting up an appointment for a student/farmer, but that will be the extent of the instructor's involvement unless additional involvement is requested by the student/farmer. In some cases, counseling may be provided to both an instructor and student if both parties agree.
