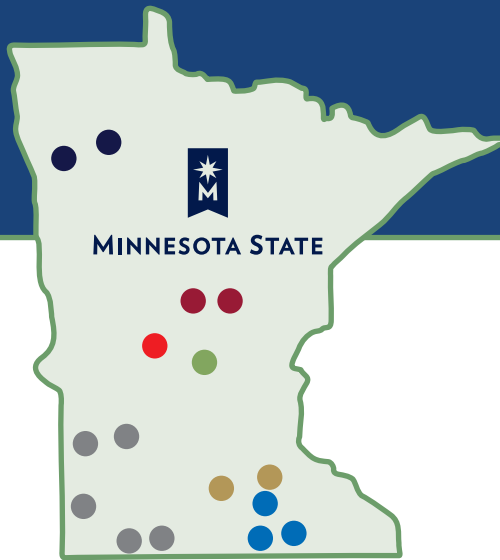


WHAT CAN I EXPECT WHEN I AM PART OF THE PROGRAM?
